Sticking to a diet low on salt reduces risk of cardiac arrest and stroke by 25% and chances of premature death by 20%.

In the first-ever comprehensive investigation undertaken to study the effects of salt on cardiovascular health, researchers from the Harvard Medical School have now offered concrete evidence that a diet rich on sodium increases risk of heart attack.

The 15 year study closely monitored participants (aged 30-54) from two trials- 744 people who participated in the first trial of hypertension prevention, that was completed in 1990, and 2,382 in the second, which ended in 1995- to analyse the connection between salt and high blood pressure.

While some participants in the study had reduced their salt consumption by nearly 35%, from about 10g to around 7g, an equally large group did not cut back their intake. Researches, after questioning the volunteers about their health in the present day, found that those who decreased their salt intake were significantly less affected by heart disease or stroke.
