- Q3. The complexity of children's thoughts have increased considerably by the end of infancy and at the beginning of pre-school. According to Jean Piaget, the period between two and seven years of age is termed as pre-operational stage. Discuss various characteristics at pre-operational stage with examples.
- **Q4.** Observe five children of age three to six years (with parent's consent) in your surrounding and write a report on the language competencies that children acquired.
- **Q5.** What do you understand by the term middle childhood? Write a report on thought process and cognitive development of child in middle childhood.
- **Q6.** Children show development in each domain such as physical-motor, language, cognitive and social-emotional. Discuss the development of a child during the age six to eight years in each domain.
- **Q7.** Observe and compare the changes related to socio-emotional development between age three to six and six to eight years.
- **Q8.** Language is the most important tool for communication and thus, understanding the development of language among young children becomes essential. Observe a child between age six to eight years and enlist the various characteristics related to language development, communication and emergent literacy.
- **Q9.** Play offers many valuable opportunities to children that contribute to their development and learning. Explain how games play a critical part in child's growth and development during early childhood? Justify your answer with the help of a suitable examples.
