**Summary**

- Flies cause dysentery; diarrhea etc and around 800000 flies can be produced in one cubic metre of garbage. Rats are majorly responsible for causing plague.
- Several solutions to the garbage disposal problem have been proposed, such as collecting waste from several cities and transferring it to a remote location where it can be burned, composted, or dumped.
- The simplest option is to recycle or reuse garbage; this method generates revenue while saving money on collection and transportation.
